WHAT IS THE BLUE FLAG?

The Blue Flag is an International voluntary eco-label for beaches and marinas. The programme aims to raise environmental awareness and promote good environmental behaviour among tourists and local populations as well as best practice among beach and marina management and staff.

The Blue Flag award is based on compliance with 32 criteria covering aspects such as:

- Environmental information and education
- Water quality
- Safety and services
- Environmental management

The International Blue Flag Programme is organised in Ireland by An Taisce – The National Trust for Ireland with support from the Department of the Environment, Community and Local Government and on behalf of the Foundation for Environmental Education (FEE).

SOME OF THE BEACH CRITERIA ARE:

- Information about the Blue Flag must be displayed.
- Environmental education activities must be offered and promoted to beach users.
- Information about bathing water quality must be displayed.
- A map of the beach indicating different facilities must be displayed.
- The beach must fully comply with the water quality sampling and frequency requirements.
- The beach must fully comply with the standards and requirements for water quality analysis.
- Waste disposal bins/containers must be available at the beach in adequate numbers and they must be regularly maintained.
- Facilities for the separation of recyclable waste materials should be available at the beach.
- An adequate number of toilet or restroom facilities must be provided.
- Access to the beach by dogs and other domestic animals must be strictly controlled.
- All buildings and beach equipment must be properly maintained.
- An adequate number of lifeguards and/or lifesaving equipment must be available at the beach.
- First aid equipment must be available on the beach.
- At least one Blue Flag beach in each municipality must have access and facilities provided for the physically disabled.

HOW THE BLUE FLAG PROGRAMME WORKS

The Blue Flag season for beaches in Ireland coincides with the bathing season which runs from the beginning of June to the middle of September. The marina season extends until December. Each year the authority managing the beach or marina applies for the Blue Flag award, it is not automatically renewed every year. An International Jury then decides whether the beach is eligible for the award. During the season inspectors assess every Blue Flag beach and marina to ensure compliance with criteria. If there are problems they are reported to the authorities and either the problems are rectified or the Blue Flag is removed.

IRELAND'S BEAUTIFUL BLUE FLAG BEACHES



SOME OF THE MARINA CRITERIA ARE:

- Information relating to local eco-systems and environmental phenomena must be available to marina users.
- The marina is responsible for offering at least three environmental education activities to the users and staff of the marina.
- The marina must have an environmental policy and an environmental plan.
- The marina must have facilities for receiving recyclable waste materials, such as bottles, cans, paper, plastic, organic material, etc.
- Bilge water pumping facilities should be present at the marina.
- Toilet pumping facilities must be present in the marina.
- All buildings and equipment must be properly maintained and be in compliance with national legislation.
- If the marina has boat repairing and washing areas, no pollution must enter the sewage system, marina land and water or the natural surroundings.
- Safety precautions and information must be posted at the marina.
- Facilities for disabled people should be in place.
- A map indicating the location of the different facilities must be posted at the marina.
- The water in the marina must be visually clean without any evidence of pollution, e.g. oil, litter, sewage or other evidence of pollution.

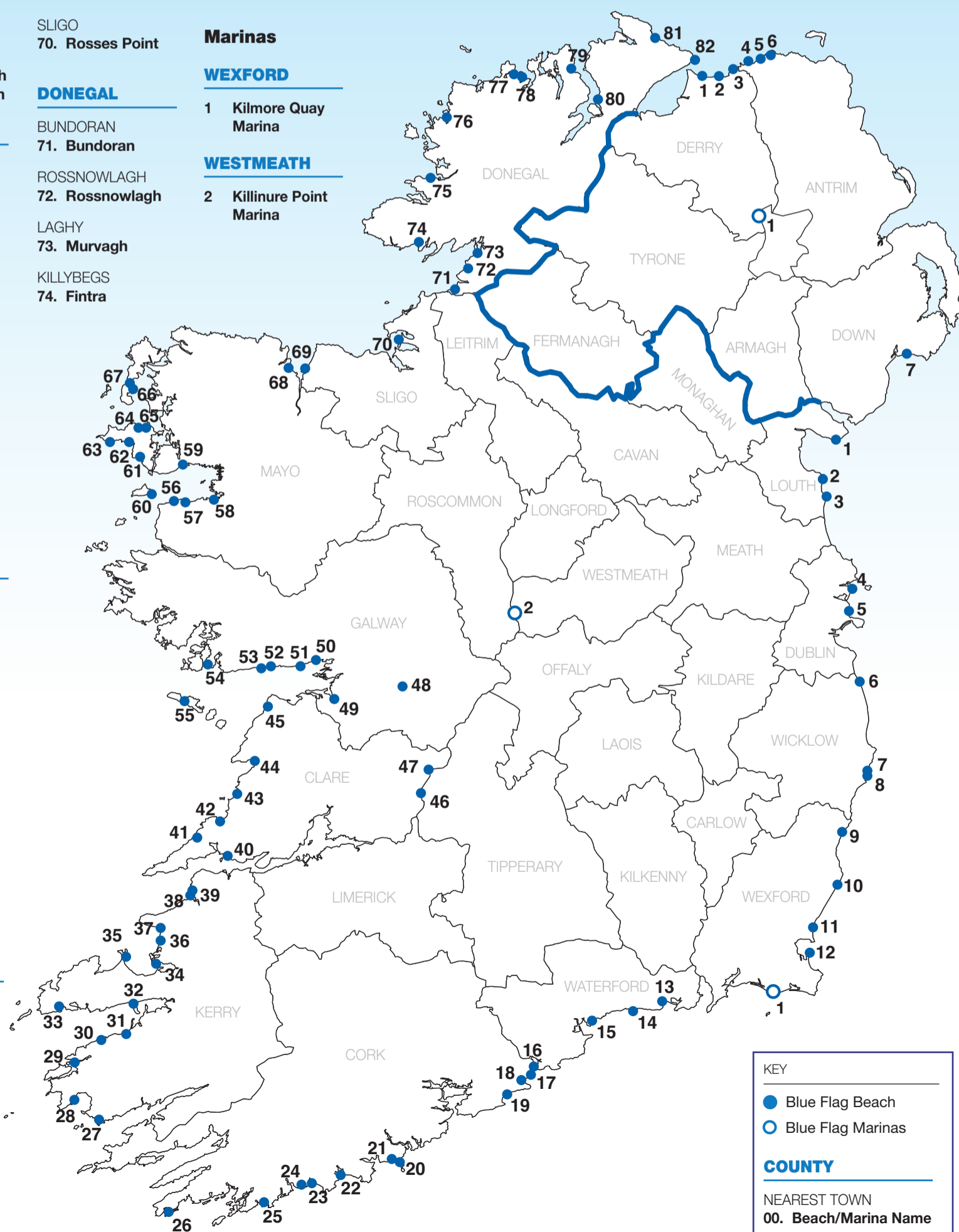
